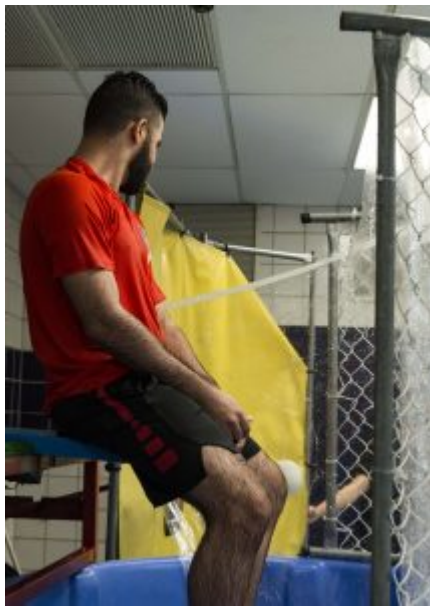


# D211 POST: CONANT TEACHERS TAKE A PLUNGE FOR CANCER AWARENESS
